Updates from members



Blue Light Day would be held on 5 July 2023.

Flo Linscott from the Police thanked Fliss Hedge from Cornwall People First and PC Sarah Treeby for getting all the money together



Cornwall Council staff are having training to help them to understand autism.

It is very important that training is led by autistic people so they are working with The Autistic Community of Cornwall



The **Making Good Change Happen** project is looking at how to make sure that people with a learning disability have the best life they can.

Some of the issues with **housing** are the same for some autistic people.

The Partnership Board will hear feedback on housing at a future meeting.



The CHAMPS were working with the **Police** to make sure that neurodiverse people could use the **Safe Places** scheme.





Cornwall Council has a new draft **Direct Payments** Policy.

The new Policy is smaller and easier to understand.

They want people that use Direct Payments to tell them how to support people to buy what they need.

They also want help to make their website better.



Cornwall Council will have practice quality standards for all Adult Social Care staff.

They will help to make sure that meetings with **Social Workers** are as good as they can be.



The Women's Centre Cornwall is working with Age UK on the abuse of elderly people.

Dina Holder is making sure that autistic individuals are able to tell their stories.



The Divas have made a film for the Police about what it is like to be interviewed by them.

It will be used to train the **Police** all over the country.



David Burns said **Citizen Checkers** hold a peer advocacy session called The Talk Together Group in Liskeard.

Also, two mental health groups are held at the Liskerrett Centre in Liskeard.

One of them is run by Mind.



The Board has a group working with the **DWP** to make communication better for people with learning disabilities or autism.

Some improvements have already been made though:

- Teaching teams about neurodiversity.
- Autism Accreditation trials with the National Autistic Society.
- More Disability Employment Advisors in Job Centres.



Cornwall Council is introducing Individual Service Funds.

The Board agreed to invite **NHS** experts to talk about **mental health** services for autistic people.

The Mental Health team has new staff and one is a specialist in autism.



The **NHS** want specialist in-patient beds in Devon.

They will be for neurodiverse people with specific needs.

But Cornwall wants mental health services to be able to cater for all autistic people in Cornwall.



The **Autistic Community of** Cornwall told the Board about their work.

They offer:

- Training
- Advocacy
- Mentorship
- Support
- · befriending.

They will tell us about their work at every meeting.



Some Board members told us that their local **GP Practice** was very good.

Staff were understanding and friendly and made reasonable adjustments.

People said how important **Annual Health Checks** are.

David said a person with lived experience should work with GP services to make sure they are as good as they can be.
