#### **Update from the DWP**



Last year the Partnership Board formed a **DWP** working group.

The aim was to make communication better.



**Job Centres** in Devon and Cornwall are now getting clearer signs.

New information leaflets have been written. They will be available online too.

A virtual walk-through is being created.

That will mean people can go online to see what their Job Centre is like before they go there.



They want every **Job Centre** in the country will go through the **Autism Accreditation Programme**.

The programme is run by the **National Autistic Society** and aims to make sure that organisations offer excellent support to autistic people.



More advocates are needed to help people to fill in their **Personal Independence Payment (PIP)** forms

Cornwall Council's Complex Needs Team have also been helping people with forms.



The **Access to Work** scheme can help you to get a job or or stay in work if you have a physical or mental health condition or disability..

The company you work for must make changes to help you do your job. They are called **reasonable adjustments**.

Easy read information is available. <u>Click</u> here.

But people are not getting help quickly enough. There is a wait of up to 16 weeks.

# Updates from the Adult Autism Assessment and Diagnosis Team



The **Adult Autism Assessment Team** is working with the **Mental Health** team to improve support for autistic adults.

Training has been set up with the help of **The Autistic Community of Cornwall** 



Getting an autism assessment still takes a long time but the wait has fallen from 4 years to 2 years.

That is not just for Cornwall. It is the same all over the country.

The Board had raised lots of concerns about the **Police**.

The Autistic Community of Cornwall and The Women's Centre Cornwall worked with the Partnership Boards team to write a report about how the Police communicate with autistic people.

Marie Ralph, Dina Holder and Robert O'Leary all went to the Police Community Reference Group in October.

Much more work needs to be done so a small group will be formed to look at all of the issues.
