Autism Strategy for Cornwall



Vicki Allan from Cornwall Council said that the Autism Strategy for Cornwall was finished and is now being checked.

Neurodiversity Identification Wristbands (NDID)



Today's **meeting is themed** around the **Keeping Safe** priority.

This looks at the **relationship between police and autistic people** and keeping **safe in relationships.**



John Holland from the Devon and Cornwall Police showed the board a new green wristband the police had made called the NDID wristband.

You can **scan the wristband with your phone**, and it will say what the **needs of the person wearing the wristband** are.
