What we talked about at the meeting



Everybody agreed that the minutes of the last meeting were correct.

Actions and Updates from members



The Police were working on an **Autism Alert Card**.

They want to link with the **Safe Places** scheme.



If you feel worried when outside you can ask for help in places that have a Safe Places sticker in the window. These are places like shops, cafes and job centres.



The Women's Centre and the **Divas** were working on an ABC of Child Sexual Abuse.

They were helping with words and pictures for cards to help people to explain their feelings.

They were also working with **Safer Cornwall**.

They wanted to speak with people aged 65 and above about domestic abuse.

Cornwall People First had held 6 Speak Up groups in the past month. 64 self-advocates joined them.

They wanted a new Outreach Worker for the East and also new volunteers.

They had 2 new projects.

The Practice Partners project wanted people to speak about GP services.

The Songflower Project helped people to learn and speak about death.





Parent Carers Cornwall gave an update.

Lots more people needed Education and Health Care Plans. That meant a lot of stress for families and staff.

More young people had mental health issues. A lot of families were taking their children out of school.

Meetings

Everyone wanted the Learning Disability Partnership Board to meet face to face again.

The next meeting would be at Cornwall Council in Truro.

It would also be on Teams for people that could not travel.

New Logo

The Board agreed that it should have a new logo and it should be designed by a self-advocate.

Members should send their designs to the Partnership Boards team.

The designer of the winning logo would get a £20 voucher.



Annual Health Checks

Fewer people with a learning disability were having an **Annual Health Check**.

Work would be done to get more people to have one.

Fliss Hedge said that **Cornwall People First** would have a Primary Care person at every Speak Up Group once a year.

Out of Area Hospitals

Nory Menneer said there were 5 people in longer stay hospitals out of Cornwall.

All had discharge plans to return.

Employability Service



Proper Job was a new scheme to help people with learning disabilities and/or autism into work.

Service User Meetings – Feedback and Updates

22 service users and self-advocates attended a **Partnership Boards** meeting in Truro in March.

People talked about:

- Communicating with the DWP.
- Professional people using jargon.
- Lack of mental health services.
- Cost of living.
- Lack of advocacy services.

More meetings would be held in June and July.

Tanya Falaschi wanted people to join the team at events. They would be called **Community Promoters**.
