# What we talked about at the meeting



People wanted to know what services were being offered in each building.

What transport was available to Newquay Town Hall for people with no family or car?

Mike would ask Ann Smith at Cornwall Council.



The Council would talk about Direct Payments at the Autism Partnership Board.

Mike would ask what people could use their money for.

How many people had bought IT equipment with their personal budget?



Ann Smith at Cornwall Council would talk about the Autism Strategy and the Learning Disability Strategy at Partnership Board meetings at the end of the year.

The group said that they wanted the meetings to stay online.



It was still very hard for people with communication issues to see a doctor.

GP staff were not trained to communicate with people with LD or Autism.

They did not understand.

People were in a lot of pain but could not see their GP to explain.

Doctors were prescribing anti-depressant medicines because no therapy was available.

People were treated like their lives were worthless.

Mike would play the recording at the Partnership Board meetings.

The Divas were still meeting online.

They were making some short films about their work. Mike would share them with the Partnership Boards.

They were giving lots of training. They would train the Police on sexual abuse and domestic violence next month.

People were worried about the Spectrum 10k project.



It collected DNA samples from Autistic people.

The project was paused three days after this meeting.

Mike would update when there was new information.



The group looked at the latest hospital passport and said how it could be made better.

Mike would send the ideas to Jane Rees at RCHT so that RCHT and other acute hospitals could look at them.

There would be an update at the next meeting.



The group were worried that people could not get to food banks because they were not getting support from a carer.

This meant that people were not eating properly or showering enough.

Kay had raised £310 for a foodbank in Liskeard.
