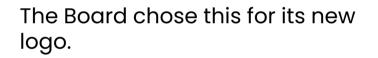


What we talked about

New Logo






It was made up from bits of 4 different designs by Board members.

Developing the Partnership Board




With help of Sam Clark from **Learning Disability England** we want to make this Partnership Board the best it can be.

Everyone said what they think is needed to do this.

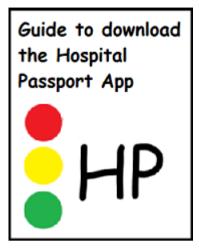
They said
